Farm to Family Launches Intergenerational Community Meals!

On June 21, Summer Solstice, the back hall was filled with many smiling faces of the island's youngest to eldest, dining together at the first of a series of Intergenerational Meals to be hosted by Farm to Family Meals Service Society (Farm to Family/F2f) over the coming months.

Farm to Family is pleased to announce that we have received funding under the Government of Canada's New Horizons for Seniors Program for our project, Building Intergenerational Connections Around Local Food.

This federal grants and contributions program supports projects that are led or inspired by seniors who are making a difference in the lives of others in their communities.

The funds will be used to provide community meals open to our recipients and volunteers, and the community at large, for free or by donation, throughout the summer, fall and winter months. At the inaugural Solstice Dinner, our fabulous and hardworking Meal Program Coordinator, Bee, and her amazing team of volunteer cooks, served up a local feast of wild sockeye frittata, herbed new potatoes, beautiful local salads, and strawberry custard tarts!

Another wonderful component of this grant project, which runs until the end of March, 2026, is our Local Food Skill Shares, where members of the community host a workshop sharing a cooking skill with neighbours and friends of all ages. So far, we've had pesto making with Richard, Instant Pot cooking with Judy, Frittata Fun with Lee Andra, and Permaculture Salad with Serendipity!

Erika Bland (President)

What is Farm to Family without Erika?! Erika is the founder, the visionary, and the leader. Erika has lived on Denman since 2012, prior to which she was an apprentice on an organic farm in Pemberton, BC. She studied Human Geography at UBC focusing on social justice, fair trade and local food systems in Canada and Central America. Erika then completed her MA in Environmental Studies; her research involved the examination of the relationship between conservation and agriculture on Denman Island. Erika loved her work for the Denman Conservancy Association from 2015 to 2022 and continues her commitment to the Conservancy as a Board member. She is also a former Board member of the Growers and Producers Alliance.

In 2020, with support from the community she began to implement her long held dream of creating Farm to Family, an organization that would address the dual needs of increased markets for farm produce and access to supplemental frozen meals for seniors and elders on the island. Erika is committed to supporting aging in place in our amazing community. Farm to Family has flourished under Erika's wise and creative leadership.

Erika and her family will be welcoming a new baby in October and she will be taking a leave from the Board for the months surrounding that occasion.

Nancy Anderson (Vice President)

Nancy is a retired Social Worker with a background working with children and adults in the disability field. In her last job, Nancy worked in a community based program that supported adults with severe brain injuries. She was also a longstanding Board member of an agency that supported people with developmental disabilities.

While Nancy and her husband have owned property on Denman for over 20 years, she has only been able to make Denman more her home in 2020, when she retired. It was then that Nancy started to participate in the Denman community. Besides volunteering on Two Roads Farm, Nancy is involved in a number of community events including the Christmas hampers, Readers and Writers Festival and the Community Auction. Nancy has recently joined Friends and Neighbours.

Nancy was delighted to join the Board in 2023. She encourages the Board to consider and embrace the 'psychosocial' benefits of providing food; the social connections made around the provision of food are vital to decrease the negative effects of social isolation on health.



Joni Daniels (Treasurer)

Joni has a long and prestigious history in the music business, promoting her first concert at the young age of 17 with legendary folk singer Stan Rogers! She was one of the crew that launched MuchMusic, stayed at MuchMusic as a producer/director there for 15 years and then became a general manager of a record label. After she lost her hearing due to loud music exposure, Joni built her own successful marketing company helping musicians find the funds for records, videos and tours.

After spending most of her life in Toronto, Joni was looking for a big change and, fortunately for our community, she chose Denman Island. Here she has pursued her-lifelong dream to be of service to her community. Many on the island would know her as a volunteer co-director with Concerts Denman, Board member of Arts Denman, and the Chair of the Denman Sponsorship group who supported a young refugee from Afghanistan to resettle in BC.

Joni joined the Farm to Family Board in 2023 and is the Treasurer. Her business, financial and fundraising background is exceedingly helpful as Farm to Family works to expand and fund its programs. The Board appreciates her ability to translate complex financial information into understandable concepts!

Megan Brousseau (Secretary)

Megan is employed full-time in the Kinesiology Department of Langara College as an instructor, Assistant Chair of the Department, and member of the Equity Diversity Inclusion Committee. Her work has a strong focus on the social determinants of health, including food security and the importance of social support.

Megan lives in Vancouver and has spent many years volunteering with and being a Board Member of the Cedar Cottage Food Network. CCFN is an independent, non-profit organization working toward more sustainable and just food systems at the neighbourhood level. The organization creates space for Kensington-Cedar Cottage residents to take part in different levels of food systems by providing programming, tools, and opportunities for community connections.

Megan has been with Farm to Family since its inception and a Board Member since the Society was registered. Sharing a strong belief in the organizational vision, she played an integral role encouraging and supporting Erika to make her dream of Farm to Family a reality. Megan has an amazing diversity of skills to contribute; her knowledge, experience, and technical skills make her a valued Board Secretary.



Noni Fenwick-Wilson (Director at Large)

Noni is a longstanding member of the Denman community. She began visiting Denman Island in the mid-seventies and lived here until 1991. After a 20+ year career teaching primary school in Royston, Noni and her husband returned to Denman 10 years ago, to make Denman their retirement home and community. Noni is a well-respected and committed volunteer on Denman. She has very much enjoyed her work with the Readers and Writers Festival since 2019.

Noni first became a volunteer with Farm to Family in January 2020 as a driver. Noni values how providing nutritious, locally sourced meals to seniors is a wonderful support to help elders to age in their own homes and community. Noni joined the Farm to Family Board in 2024. One of the newer Farm to Family Board members, Noni was quick to jump into the operational side of our society, working closely with Bee to ensure that all food production is safe and efficient as possible.

Elina (Lee) Blomley (Director at Large)

Lee's academic background as well as her work experience testify to her belief that all communities should have the right of access to food in a dignified way. Prior to coming to Denman, Lee completed graduate academic research through SFU's Food System Lab, working with the South Island Farm hub to expand their aggregation of local food. She was also involved in miscellaneous mutual aid efforts to ensure all in community are fed. For 7 years Lee has worked on farms throughout the province in both rural and urban contexts.

Lee is a new community member on Denman. She moved here in 2024 to join the staff of Two Roads Farm as a full-time employee. Lee took no time to become an active contributor to the Denman community: she is also a medical first responder with the Denman Island Volunteer Fire Department.

Lee believes in Farm to Family's vision of bolstering a strong local food system through feeding our community and supporting food growers. Her education and experience lend a valuable and well-informed perspective to the Farm to Family work.
